

Education: Academic Achievements

IGDTUW currently offers various inter-disciplinary and industry relevant programs in Science, Engineering, Management & Architecture. At present IGDTUW is offering 9 Undergraduate programs, 8 Post Graduate programs, 1 Dual Degree program besides PhD programs in advance and emerging areas of Technology. The UG and PG programs of IGDTUW offers most modern curricula, based on the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS), having rich mix of courses from Science, Engineering, Management, Social Sciences, Humanities, Fine Arts, Liberal Arts, Classical Music, Sports, etc. The course curricula have been developed with a view to integrate advancements in Science and Engineering, while also incorporating Industry relevant Technologies. The University has started the implementation of various provisions of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. Important features viz. Establishment of a separate Research and Development (R&D) Cell, International Student Office, Alumni Office, IPR Cell are already implemented.

The provision of multi-disciplinary approach has been implemented in the University wherein, a student can opt for Elective Courses from other Disciplines/ Department. Other innovative features like Credit Transfers, Earning of Credits from MOOCS Courses, Internship in Industry at the end of every academic year are already implemented. Regarding implementation of National Credit Framework [NCF] of NEP it is intimated that from the Academic Year 2023-24, University has incepted Ability Enhancement Courses [AEC], Skill Enhancement Courses [SEC] and Value Addition Courses [VAC] in the curriculum. The University has started curriculum revision process to align its credit framework with NHEQF and introduce the provision of Multiple-entries and Multiple-exits in all its programs.

Research and Development

The University has made significant progress in the R&D domain for carrying out sponsored research projects from reputed agencies such as DST, MietY, DietY, DPIIT, SERB etc. IGDTUW has received total funding of about Rs. 20 Cr (only in last two years). The University has also undertaken Consultancy Projects. The total number of patents filed in the last two years are 45 out of which 08 patents have been granted. The total number of research publication by the University during 2021 and 2022 were 700 including journals and conferences.

The Hon'ble LG of Delhi/Chancellor, IGDTUW and esteemed members of the Court expressed their appreciation and commendation for the University's remarkable progress, outstanding performance, and unwavering efforts in advancing quality education. They also acknowledged the University's dedication to achieving international recognition and facilitating successful placements for its students.

The University Court noted the Progress of the University and passed the Annual Report.

Further, the University Court also advised that the University may have more collaborations and MoUs with the Indian Institutes of repute for the holistic development of the student, staff and faculty as well as create our own standards to compete with global level institutions.

Besides this, it was suggested that the University also promote the students those who won the medals in the Sports Activities. Furthermore, it was also suggested that all the Universities of Government of Delhi may share their best practices with each other.

Hon'ble Chancellor suggested that local requirements should be the focus area for research in the University. He advised that students should be encouraged to appreciate our inherent values and follow basic civic manners such as maintaining cleanliness, following traffic rules, etc.

The University was advised to provide technological solutions and support to various govt. agencies in Delhi. Real time exposure to technologies may be given to students by collaborating with various government agencies like NDMC/MCD/PWD.

It was advised that the University should make efforts to further improve the rankings of the university.

It was advised that University Court meetings may be held timely as per the provisions in the Act and Statues of the University.

Agenda Item 5.05: To Present the Placement Record of the University

In the dynamic landscape of placements, our students at IGDTUW have achieved remarkable success, breaking previous records and raising the bar for excellence. The presented numbers highlight our commitment to nurturing talent and fostering industry-academia collaborations for the benefit of our students.

- For the pass out Batch 2022, more than 116 companies visited the campus with a total number of 829 offers. More than 271 Summer Internship offers were rolled out for third year girls (i.e., passing out next year 2023) and 95 six-months internship offers were for fourth year girls.
- Students bagged international offers and have been offered a highest package of Rs. 1.2 Crores per annum by Amazon Dublin. Further, two students were offered the highest Internship offer at Facebook London, with the whooping stipend of 4.2 Lakhs per month.

- At National level, the highest CTC bagged by the students has been to the tune of Rs. 55 Lakhs from Adobe and Highest Internship package of Rs. 1.6 Lakhs per month from Uber.
- The average salary for these pre-placement offers was Rs. 30 lakhs (Approx.) per annum.
- The Placement Season for the batch 2023 concluded with resounding success, witnessing the presence of 128 companies on our campus and resulting in an impressive total of 891 offers. 367 Internship offers were rolled to third year girls. 452 Full time employment offers and 72 Six-month internship offers were rolled to batch 2023.
- The Highest CTC (Full-Time Employment) reached an exceptional Rs. 82 Lakhs from Atlassian with an average CTC of Rs. 24.50 Lakhs per annum and the highest stipend received during internship was Rs. 1,60,000 per month and an average stipend was of Rs. 64,000 per month.
- The Placement Season for the batch 2024, students of IGDTUW bagged remarkable offers from top notch companies like Atlassian, Intuit, Microsoft, Adobe, Google, Uber, and many more, setting new records. 538 offers (FTE: 334 and Summer Intern:204) were extended to the students till September 29, 2023, by 58 recruiters. The placement drive is going on in full swing with many more companies scheduled to come.
- Highest Placement offer is INR 56 Lakhs per annum and Highest Internship Offer INR 1.77 Lakhs per month by Uber.
- The average CTC so far is a whopping 23.7LPA and the average stipend for the summer internship is 90,573 per month.
- Many companies are visiting our campus for the first time like Airtel Digital, Texas Instruments, TransUnion LLC, Volvo and Celigo.

The University Court appreciated the efforts of the University.

Agenda Item 5.06: To Present the Audited Annual Statement of Accounts of the University for the Financial Year 2020-21 and 2021-22

The Vice Chancellor, IGDTUW briefed about the status of funding received from GNCTD in the form of Grant-in-Aid and expenditure incurred and also presented the Audited Financial Statements of the University for the Financial Year 2020-21 and 2021-22. The Audited Report for the Financial Year 2020-21 and 2021-22 prepared by the CAG empanelled auditor was placed before the Court. The status of the various CAG Audit Para was also appraised to the Court.

The University Court considered and passed the Audited Annual Statement of Accounts of the University for the Financial Year 2020-21 and 2021-22.

Further, the University Court also suggested that the University may promote Fee Waiver Schemes to the meritorious students of the University.

It was advised that the financial management of the university should be made robust and University funds should be utilized properly.

Agenda Item 5.07: Establishment of Various Centre of Excellence (COE) in the University

The University Court was informed that the University has successfully established the following fully operational Centers of Excellence supported by various Government agencies

in certain research fields for Demand Driven Innovation and Translational Research:

- (i) Centre of Excellence in Artificial Intelligence (CoE-AI)
- (ii) Centre of Excellence in Advanced Mechatronics (CoE-AMS)
- (iii) Centre of Excellence in Innovation & Entrepreneurship
- (iv) Centre of Excellence for Science of Happiness

The University Court appreciated the steps taken by the University for establishment of Centres of Excellence in the University.

Agenda Item 5.08: To Apprise the University Court Regarding the Status of Permanent Campus of IGDTUW at Narela, Delhi

The University Court was informed that IGDTUW has been allotted a plot of total area measuring 19.98 Hectare for the establishment of the permanent campus of the University at Narela. IGDTUW officially took possession of this land on 19th October 2022.

Furthermore, this matter was presented during the 15th meeting of the Building & Works Committee (BWC) on July 28, 2023. The BWC committee recommended that the University should engage with the PWD Project Division for appointment of an architect and for the overall execution of the project for the development of IGDTUW's permanent campus.

As suggested by the committee, IGDTUW contacted PWD projects division on September 1, 2023, wherein, details pertaining to the Permanent Campus of IGDTUW were discussed. PWD has submitted a preliminary estimate amounting Rs. 6.93 Crore (approx.) for the construction of boundary wall, which was placed before the Secretary DTTE, GNCTD and recently, DTTE, GNCTD has sanctioned A/S and E/S for an amount of Rs. 6.93 Cr. for the construction of the boundary wall.

Various meetings with PWD authorities for the planning and construction of permanent Campus of IGDTUW have been conducted. The last meeting was held with the officials of Electrical and Civil Engineering Divisions including Additional General Manager, PWD Project Division and Architect Wing of the PWD. The draft document comprising the requirement of Academic Departments, Administrative Bocks, COEs, Innovation Centre, Hostel, Residential complex, Auditorium, Conference Hall, Lecture Complex and other common amenities etc. has been discussed and shared with PWD Project Division.

The University Court noted the Status of Permanent Campus of IGDTUW at Narela, Delhi.

Agenda Item 5.09: To Apprise the University Court Regarding the Progress on Construction of the Girls Hostel Block at Old NSIT Block, Madarsa Road, Kashmere Gate, Delhi

The University Court was appraised as under:

- (i) The Department of Training and Technical Education (DTTE), Govt. of Delhi has issued the Expenditure Sanction of Rs. 49.92 Crore and one third amount *i.e.* Rs. 16.64

Creore as first Instalment to the Chief Project Manager, DTTDC However the amount is yet to be released by DTTE to DTTDC.

- (ii) DTTDC has informed that the approval of Delhi Urban Art Commission (DUAC) and Delhi Fire Services (DFS) has been obtained. The architectural consultant has applied for following approval at MCD and awaiting the
- (a) NOC from Heritage Conservation Committee (HCC).
 - (b) National Monument Authority (NMA).

Further after getting above approvals, the tendering process for construction of the Hostel will be done by DTTDC.

The University Court noted the Progress on Construction of the Girls Hostel Block at Old NSIT Block, Madarsa Road, Kashmere Gate, Delhi.


Agenda Item 5.10: Presentation of the Strategic Plan of the University
